

LICENSED TECHNICIAN POSITION AVAILABLE

Lien Animal Clinic in Seattle, WA is currently seeking an additional licensed technician to join our team. Our client-oriented practice emphasizes compassionate care and high quality medicine and surgery. Patients are primarily dogs and cats but we see a growing number of rabbits and other small furry mammals. Our doctors rely on licensed technicians to place catheters, collect lab samples, induce and monitor anesthesia, take plain and contrast radiographs, and provide patient nursing care. We have outgrown our current facility and have begun the process of building a new hospital that we hope to occupy in the fall of 2008. Good organizational skills and ability to work as a team with other staff members required. We are looking for a technician with a good sense of humor and positive outlook on life and the profession. Both in-house and outside continuing education is required for all employees on a regular basis. Licensed technicians are paid to attend a national CE conference every other year.

Like for all hospital positions, the job is physically demanding requiring long hours of constant walking and moving throughout the hospital. Some lifting and carrying of pets and product is required up to 50 lbs. This position requires a current Washington State Veterinary Technician license.

The tentative schedule for this position is somewhat flexible and may include 3 to 4 days per week for a total of about 20 to 40 hours per week. The position would require working most Saturdays from 8 am to 4 pm.

Salary is dependent on experience. Employees working more than 32 hours/week are eligible for full benefits including full medical, dental, and disability insurance, paid vacation and sick leave, uniform allowance, discounted veterinary care, and paid continuing education.

The top candidates for the position will be invited back for several hours of clinic observation, a written exam, and a second interview.
